



EVIDENCE OF SYSTEM

PART I

Section 15 of the Evidence Act provides that "where there is a question whether an act was accidental or intentional or done with a particular knowledge or intention, the fact that such act formed part of a series of similar occurrences, in each of which the person doing the act was concerned, is relevant".¹

The general principle has been stated by Lord Herschell in *Makin v. Attorney-General of N.S.W.*², "it is undoubtedly not competent for the prosecution to adduce evidence tending to show that the accused has been guilty of criminal acts, other than those covered by the indictment, for the purpose of leading to the conclusion that the accused is a person likely from his criminal conduct or character to have committed the offence for which he is being tried. On the other hand the mere fact that the evidence adduced tends to show the commission of other crimes does not render it inadmissible, if it be relevant to an issue before the jury, and it may be so relevant if it bears upon the question whether the acts alleged to constitute the crime charged in the indictment were designed or accidental or to rebut a defence which would otherwise be open to the accused. The statement of these general principles is easy but it is obvious that it may often be very difficult to draw the line and to decide whether a particular piece

¹This should be read with section 14 which reads -

"Facts showing the existence of any state of mind, such as intention, knowledge, good faith, negligence, rashness, ill-will or good will towards any particular person, or showing the existence of any state of body or bodily feeling, are relevant when the existence of any such state of mind or body or bodily feeling is in issue or relevant". In the Indian case of *Empress v. Vyapoori Moodaliar* (1881) 8 Cal. L.R. 197 a question of law was referred to the High Court "whether in trying the three specific charges of receiving illegal gratification from the firm of Cohen Brothers at Tonghoo in 1876, evidence of similar but unconnected illegal gratifications from the same firm at Thayetmyo in the years 1877 and 1878 is admissible". It was held that the evidence was not admissible. Reference was made to S.14 of the Evidence Act and Garth C.J. said, "We must be very careful not to extend the operation of the section to other cases, where the question of guilt or innocence depends upon *actual facts* and not upon the state of a person's mind or feeling. We have no right to prove that a man committed theft or any other crime on one occasion by showing that he committed similar offences on other occasions."
